

We, in Mount Morris, Illinois, will observe the 25th anniversary of our national bell-ringing promotion from July 1 through July 5. The president helped me start the promotion when he came to our village on April 30, 1963 to speak and ring. Every July 4 we team up with Hobart Cawood, superintendant of Independence Hall National Park. Welcome back to Washington! Your appointment as Chief of Staff at the White House was a surprise but what a joyous and solid surprise!


