Dear Mr. McKeel:

Thank you for your letter of July 29, expressing your objection to the provision in the Senate-passed trade bill requiring advance notification of plant closings and mass layoffs.

The Administration will insist on removal of the Senate provision during the House-Senate conference on the trade bill. Contrary to the objectives of trade legislation, mandatory advance notice would make America less competitive, not more.

In his most recent letter to the Senate on this legislation, the Secretary of Labor stated that inclusion of any mandatory plant closing provision would make it impossible for the President's senior advisers to recommend approval of a trade bill.

Thank you for sharing with me your views on this subject.
