

McINTOSH, DAVID M.: Files, 1987-1988 – REAGAN LIBRARY COLLECTIONS

This collection is available in whole for research use. Some folders may still have withdrawn material due to Freedom of Information Act restrictions. Most frequent withdrawn material is national security classified material, personal privacy, protection of the President, etc.

McINTOSH, DAVID M.: Files, 1987-1988 (5.2 l. ft., Boxes 1-14)

Office of Domestic Affairs, 1987-1988

David McIntosh was born in Oakland, California, but was raised in Kendallville, Indiana. He attended Yale University, where he graduated with a B.A. in 1980, and later received a J.D. from University of Chicago Law School in 1983. In 1982, he was a founding member of the Federalist Society.

In June of 1985 David McIntosh, (1958-) served in the Deputy Assistant Attorney General's Office of Legal Policy and in June of 1986 he became Special Assistant to the Attorney General. In July 1987, he was picked by Kenneth Cribb to work in the Office of Domestic Affairs and in December of 1987, he became Special Assistant to the President for Domestic Affairs. He left the White House in August of 1988 to work on Christopher Cox's successful campaign for the House of Representatives in Southern California.

In the George H. W. Bush's administration, he served as executive director of Vice President Dan Quayle's Council for Competitiveness. McIntosh later served as the U.S. Representative for Indiana's 2nd Congressional district from 1995 to 2001. McIntosh was also the Republican nominee for Governor of Indiana in 2000. Since 2001, McIntosh has been a partner in the Washington law firm of Mayer Brown. In December 2014, McIntosh was named the president of the Club for Growth.

When the Library arranged this material, it was discovered that a portion of folders had been removed by David McIntosh at the White House in August of 1988. The Office of Records Management inserted out cards for the missing folders. They do not appear to have been returned. If they are discovered later, they will be integrated at that time. These folders are marked (White House Checkout Card Only).

SERIES I: SUBJECT FILE, 1987-1988, (2.4 l. ft. Boxes 1-7)

This series consists of material primarily on domestic issues. The majority of the material is related to civil rights, constitutional law, fair housing and sentencing guidelines. In August, 1988, McIntosh removed a group of folders from his stored collections at the White House and so there are a number of folders titles within this series that consist of White House out cards only. The Library has been unable to locate any of the removed material.

This subject file also contains a significant number of folders related to the *Grove City College v. Bell* case. In 1984, the United States Supreme Court ruled that Title IX (equal opportunity for

women and girls participation in school activities) should be applied to private schools with students receiving federally funded scholarships even if the institution refused any direct federal funding. Prior to this ruling, Title IX had been applied only to colleges and universities receiving direct federal funding.

The material is arranged alphabetically by folder title.

SERIES II: JUDICIAL NOMINATION FILE (2.8 l. ft., Boxes 7-14)

This series consists of material related to the judicial nomination process. The majority of the material is related to the Bork, Ginsburg, and Kennedy judicial nominations. The series is arranged alphabetically by folder title.
