Dear Mr. President,

In seeking peace in the Middle East between Israel and the Palestinian Arabs, I wish to suggest this option for your consideration: Appoint Jimmy Carter to be mediator between the Israelis and the Arabs. My reasons for suggesting him are the following:

1) Almost single-handedly he facilitated the only peace agreement between Israel and an Arab state. Though I recognize the Camp David Accords are flawed (flawed mainly, in my opinion, because the Palestinian Arabs took no part in negotiations which concerned their future status), they have resulted in peace between the largest Arab state, Egypt, and Israel for almost 10 years and the return to Egypt of a huge slice of captured and occupied territory, the Sinai.

2) Two of the major issues which existed prior to the Camp David Accords exist today: negotiating with adversaries who fought wars with each other and returning occupied land.

3) Former President Carter is, I believe, one of the most knowledgeable persons on the Middle East living today.

4) He is acceptable to and respected by Israel and the Arab states as much as, and probably more so, than any other person.

5) He is sensitive to ^{the} wishes, needs and anxieties of the Israelis and the Palestinian Arabs, fervently devoted to peace, and a tireless, persistent and able negotiator.

I am quite aware that the circumstances preceding the Camp David Meetings are different from those existing today. Perhaps the most important difference is that we have neither an Arab nor an Israeli leader who is willing to

risk coming forward with new and bold initiatives to seek peace, as Anwar el Sadat did.

Notwithstanding, the stakes are too high and the cause too important for us to overlook any opportunity to seek and find a non-military, peaceful settlement of the crisis.

For the reasons stated above I suggest Jimmy Carter as the person you might consider tapping for this most difficult and important assignment.

Now I do not know that you would wish to ask Mr. Carter to undertake this task, nor do I know that he would agree to do so. But I do know that we should seek the very finest and best qualified American we possibly can for the job.

I do not pretend to know the answers nor the methods to resolve the troubles which have plagued this region for so many years. Possibly, just possibly, my suggestion of

asking Jimmy Carter to undertake this assignment may have merit in achieving these ends. I submit it to you in that spirit.




Thank you for signing Title XVII of Public Law 98-575 which established the United States Institute of Peace. This Institute, organized to explore non-violent alternatives to international conflict resolution, can be a critical element in this country's search for a lasting world peace.

According to the provisions which established the Institute, its fifteen member board must be nominated within three months of January 20th. Therefore, to insure that the Peace Institute becomes more than a concept, it is critical that you begin the selection process for the eleven Presidential nominees.

To be effective members of the Institute board, these nominees should have substantial training in peace studies, conflict resolution, and international affairs. They should also have practical experience in peacemaking on an international and national level. Perhaps most importantly, they should be relatively impartial, open to the public's varying views of the peacemaking process and sufficiently committed to conflict resolution processes to be able to chart the future course of the Peace Institute. Although I am not in a position to suggest many possible nominees, one person who I would strongly urge you to consider is your predecessor, **President Jimmy Carter.**

I will be looking forward to learning of your nominees to this very important government board. Thank you for your attention to this matter.
