After the State Dinner for Mrs. Thatcher, Ruth and I went to our daughter's home in Florida for Thanksgiving, and now we are on a Caribbean island somewhere east of Puerto Rico (St. Martins).

Ruth and I have recounted every detail of that glittering affair. We had never seen the White House so beautiful, nor had we seen the dining room so magnificent. Naturally, I was highly honored and surprised to find that my seat was next to you. I am thankful that you sat on the side of my good ear! I had some difficulty hearing Carol Price. She finally asked me if I was hearing her, and I told her that I was not. She immediately said that she felt that people ought to tell each other at a dinner table which is their good or bad ear! I think it makes sense.

Ruth and I were overwhelmed to be invited, and are deeply grateful.

I also want to thank you for the invitation and marvelous lunch for the Presidential Medal of Freedom recipients on November 10.

I have not seen or talked to the Bushes since that evening, but have followed in the papers (such as we can get here) the various appointments.

I cannot tell you how much we respect and love you. Whether we see you again in Washington before the Inauguration, I do not know. But we certainly look forward to seeing you on our trips to California.

If there is anything that we can ever do to help you in any way, please do not hesitate to call.

I will write to your husband sometime later my evaluation of his Presidency from a religious and spiritual standpoint. It has been the high water mark since Abraham Lincoln, and I was delighted that Mrs. Thatcher referred to it in her remarks at the dinner.
